Highlights of the training include how to break out a window by hitting it in the corner and not the center, during Lockdown situations try to create barriers, Law Enforcement Officers job is to neutralize the threat, break the OODA Loop (Observe-Orient-Decide-Act-Loop), try to break the assailants concentration and work your way out of the building, don't pick up a gun on the floor, cover up the gun, put gun in a box if one is available, tell Law Enforcement Officers a gun is in the box and give the box to the officers don't carry the gun out in open sight, when you evacuate get out of the building and run until you feel safe. Mr. Ladage provided exit options from the Council Chambers to Council Members

Mayor Diercks and Council Members thanked Mr. Ladage for the training.
