The first meeting of November for the Denver City Council, Bremer County, Iowa was held on Monday November 6, 2017 at the Denver City Hall Council Chambers. Council Members present were Sean Hartman, Jeremie Peterson, Mary Scharnhorst and Joel Wikner. Councilman Mark Richmann was absent. Councilman Jeremie Peterson arrived at 7:01 p.m. There were twenty-two people in attendance.

Mayor Diercks called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Motion Scharnhorst, second Hartman to approve the agenda. AYES: Hartman, Scharnhorst, Wikner. NAYS: None.

Motion Wikner, second Scharnhorst to approve the minutes of October 16, 2017 Regular Meeting. AYES: Hartman, Peterson, Scharnhorst, Wikner. NAYS: None.

There was no Public Forum.

Motion Wikner, second Peterson to Close the Regular Meeting and Open the Public Hearing to consider the 2018 South State Street Reconstruction Project and special Assessment of Property Owners for the Proposed Improvements. AYES: Hartman, Peterson, Scharnhorst, Wikner. NAYS: None.

Mayor Diercks explained the reason for the Public Hearing was to hear comments from the Public concerning the 2018 South State Street Reconstruction Project and Special Assessment of Property Owners and then asked Engineer Kelly Scott and Tim Wallace to present the project to the public. Kelly Scott informed the Council they have met with Utility Company Representatives and any utility relocations should be completed by April 1, 2018. The project will have 90 working days, with rain delays it should be completed in 5-6 months after the contractor begins work. Tim Wallace explained the staging of the project to allow access in and out of businesses during construction. Kelly Scott said there is no tree removal on the project. After the Engineers comments Mayor Diercks said we would just go around the room and ask everyone present if they were for or against the proposed Special Assessments. Larry Farley received comments prior to the Public Hearing from Tierney & Moeller Properties LLC and had a conversation with Tina Moeller of Martin Health Services they are fine with the curb & gutter being replaced but are opposed to having to replace a perfectly good driveway approach into their business. They do not believe they should have to pay for the driveway approach. They are opposed to the driveway approach assessment. Larry Farley read the letter during the Public Hearing that was submitted by the Seegers Family – TSBS Properties and Doretta Seegers Rev Trust is opposed to the sidewalk on the West side of the street due to numerous reasons including safety. Refer to their letter for their list of reasons. First Maxfield Insurance Assn. - Randy Druvenga informed Larry Farley he has to run it through his board but are not objecting to the project. Arnie Gienau expressed concern about drainage issues but was ok with the project. Anne Stratton had no comments. Tyson Lanus doesn't see the need for the sidewalk on the West side of the street and most of the town lives on the East side of the street, we only need sidewalk on one side of the street. Tyson Lanus was also concerned about drainage. Terri Seegers expressed concern about the liability created by the Temp Road Access during construction. Kelly Scott stated the General Contractor is responsible for General Liability during the street construction but would look into a fence around the Temp Road Access during construction. Brent Stanek representing DeVries Properties Four LLC, DeVries Financial was opposed to the project. Ed Blumenshine felt the sidewalk on the West Side of the street seems like an unnecessary expense and is objecting to the 6' bike path is useless and is really useless on the East Side of the Street since we already have a sidewalk on that side of the street. Mr. Blumenshine suggested we widen the sidewalk and not widen the street and keep a 24' wide street. Mr. Blumenshine also felt the Council is trying to rush the project and that it has not been explained well enough to the public. Cassandra Hales of 1020 South State

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Street wants to keep her Apple Tree and is opposed to the special assessment. Kyle Wooldrik was opposed to the special assessment. Brent Wooldrik was opposed to the special assessment. Brent Wooldrik was opposed to all the storm water being directed into the drainage ditch next to his property and the storm water coming from the East side of the street. Brent Wooldrik also said the storm water detention basin on the East side of the street has never worked. Brent Stanek called from his cell phone his dad Dennis Stanek who came to the Public Hearing and was opposed to the special assessment and felt the street was ok in its present condition, also asked how many other streets in town don't have curb & gutter. Brent Wooldrik called Ann Rossol from his cell phone and then he put Ann Rossol on the speaker of his cell phone and Ann Rossol was against the special assessment. Anna Everding was in favor of the special assessment. After hearing all the comments for and against the special assessments Larry Farley calculated the totals. There were 72.26% opposed to the special assessments and 27.74% were either in favor or had no comment against the special assessments.

Motion Hartman, second Scharnhorst to Close the Public Hearing concerning the 2018 South State Street Reconstruction Project and Re-Open the Regular Meeting regarding the Special Assessment of Property Owners for the Proposed Improvements. AYES: Hartman, Peterson, Scharnhorst, Wikner. NAYS: None. The Public Hearing was closed at 8:27 p.m.
