

The second meeting of August for the Denver City Council, Bremer County, Iowa was held on Monday August 2, 2021, at the Denver City Hall Council Chambers. Council Members present were Sean Hartman, Mark Richmann, Joel Wikner, Matt Wittenburg. Councilman Gavin carman was absent. There were ten people present.

Mayor Diercks called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Motion Richmann, second Wittenburg to Approve the Agenda. AYES: Hartman, Richmann, Wikner, Wittenburg. NAYS: None.

Motion Hartman, second Richmann to approve the Minutes of August 2, 2021, Regular Meeting. AYES: Hartman, Richmann, Wikner, Wittenburg. NAYS: None.

There was no Public Forum.

Marv Kramer, Ryan Tucker and J.P. Sager were present to represent the Denver Lions Club request for a Lions Club Member Memorial / Member Memorial Wall to be made out granite and measure approximately 9' long and 4' high, it will be lighted and a flagpole with a brick base, the Memorial Wall be constructed in the area near the newest Lions Club Shelter and face Mill Street. The Lions Club is seeking City Council permission to proceed with the planning and project details to be able to construct it at Prestien Park. The schedule would be to start construction next Spring and to have it completed by the Denver Breakaway Days.

Motion Richmann, second Wittenburg to allow the Denver Lions Club to continue planning for construction of a Denver Lions Memorial Wall at Prestien Park. AYES: Hartman, Richmann, Wikner, Wittenburg. NAYS: None.

Chad Widdel and Josh Schoville were present to request having Fireworks at Home Football Games this season. They would be Class C Fireworks and shot off by members of the Denver Fire Department.

Mike Place and Dave Hanson representing RSPN presented a proposal for providing technology services to City Hall.

Motion Richmann, second Wikner to approve Resolution No. 54-2021 Pay Request #1 for the Iowa Street Electric Underground Distribution Conversion Project in the amount of \$102,899.33. ROLL CALL VOTE: AYES: Hartman, Richmann, Wikner, Wittenburg. NAYS: None.

Larry Farley updated the City Council on the Electric Department. The two new Lineman are William Edgerly who is already working for the City and Ryan Petersburg who will begin on August 23, 2021.

The City Council reviewed transaction fees for utility customers presently using ACH that will be converted to using E-Check once Frontdesk is implemented.

The city received 23 applications for the Water/Sewer Operator Position. Interviews will be scheduled with the Personnel Committee in the next two weeks.

Motion Richmann, second Wikner to approve setting Halloween Trick or Treat Night for October 31, 2021, between 5:00 p.m. and 7:00 p.m. AYES: Hartman, Richmann, Wikner, Wittenburg. NAYS: None.

Motion Richmann, second Hartman to accept Janitor Mike Richards Resignation to Retire from his employment with the City effective on September 30, 2021. AYES: Hartman, Richmann, Wikner, Wittenburg. NAYS: None.

Motion Wikner, second Richmann to advertise the Help Wanted Ad for the Janitor Position. AYES: Hartman, Richmann, Wikner, Wittenburg. NAYS: None.

Motion Richmann, second Wikner to approve Stokes Welding Proposal to repair the Dump Box on the 2001 Sterling Dump Truck in the amount of \$6,500. AYES: Hartman, Richmann, Wikner, Wittenburg. NAYS: None.

The Council authorized Kyle Durant to order new signs for the Jefferson City Bike Trail.

Motion Hartman, second Wikner to approve a Class C Liquor License for AllyCatz Grubhouse d/b/a AllyCatz LLC. AYES: Hartman, Richmann, Wikner, Wittenburg. NAYS: None.

In Other Business Councilman Richmann proposed the city may need to investigate having a Technology Advisor for all the City's technology equipment and future needs.
